### 8th Grade - What's Different?

There are many decisions to be made by students and parents of 8<sup>th</sup> Grade students.

Where does my child go to high school? Should my child apply to the vo-tech? Should my child apply to a private school? What is the application process? Who do I contact for information about my child's high school options?

### Somerville High School

#### **Introductory Applied level (A)**

Courses follow the content specific New Jersey Core Curriculum Content Standards employing strategies that address the specific needs of diverse learners. These strategies provide preparation for students who wish to enter a college and/or university

#### **College Prep Courses- (CP)**

College preparation courses are designed to challenge motivated students in a specific content curricular area. These courses provide preparation for students who wish to enter a college and/or university program.

#### **SHS Honors Program**

- 90% average in subject area at mid-year of grade 8 or 80% in honors class (Geometry).
- Student Self-Assessment Questionnaire.
- Signed parent (guardian)/student honors program agreement form.
- Students who do not meet the grade criteria of a 90% or better at mid-year of grade 8 may appeal to have his/her grades averaged at the end of the 3rd marking period. At such time, if the grade average is a 90% or above, the student will qualify for participation.

### **SHS Honors Program**

- Honors Biology during freshman year requires a 90 average in 8th grade Science and completion of Algebra or Geometry
- Honor classes offered in 9th grade include:
   Geometry, Algebra 2, Biology, English 1, World
   Studies, Spanish 2 and French 2.



# SHS Academy Programs

Somerville Academy of Liberal Arts (SALA)

a partnership between SHS and Raritan Valley Community College. This program allows students to earn both a high school diploma and an Associate's Degree over the period of four years.



# SHS Academy Programs

Somerville Medical Sciences Academy (SMSA)

a partnership with Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital. In this program, students spend a portion of their day at RWJ for courses in the areas of science and allied health care.



# SHS Academy Programs

### **LaRue Public Relations Academy**

A partnership with LaRue PR in Bound Brook that allows students with required coursework in business and art to pursue an internship opportunity during Senior Year.

### **Private Schools**


Bring in a <u>signed Transcript Release Form</u> and give it to Guidance Department (the school that you are applying for should give this to you.)
